We recently shared University of California benefits [Open Enrollment information](#) for 2020. Please take time to read through the information, so you can make the best decisions for you and your family. UC offers some of the most generous health care and retirement benefits in the Bay Area.

At UCSF Health, we continue to partner with regional hospitals and doctors so you and your family can get quality care at our top-ranked facilities and in your own neighborhood. In particular, we are expanding your options for outpatient care in the East Bay and San Mateo County, including:

- The Berkeley Outpatient Center (BOPC), our joint venture with John Muir Health, which offers primary and specialty care, plus x-ray, ultrasound and lab services, under one roof. Beginning February 2020, you can access cancer services at BOPC such as medical oncology, infusion, and breast surgery. Additional services such as radiation and ambulatory surgery are planned. We also are working together to further expand our cancer services in Walnut Creek over the next two years.
- New UCSF Health cancer services, beginning January 2020 in San Mateo and Redwood City, including diagnosis, treatment, infusion and bone marrow biopsies.
- The San Mateo Primary and Specialty Care Clinic, which also will open in January and offer family and internal medicine, including cardiology, orthopedics, GI/hepatology, women's health services, radiology and pediatric specialties.

This is our fourth Open Enrollment offering Canopy Health, an alliance of nearly 5,000 providers. More than 14,000 UC employees and their dependents have access to Canopy Health's broad network, which provides flexibility to you and your family, since your primary care provider and specialists don't have to belong to the same medical group.

If you are a Health Net Blue & Gold member and choose a primary care doctor with one of these medical groups (UCSF Health/Hill Physicians-San Francisco, Meritage Medical Network, or John Muir Health), your doctor can make referrals to any clinically appropriate specialist within Canopy Health.

UCSF also provides a range of [primary care options](#). Additionally, primary care doctors at the One Medical practice in San Francisco are affiliates of UCSF and can make referrals for specialty care.

Health insurance decisions can be complex, and they are important for you and your family. Your choices impact where you can get health care when you need it. Please use the open enrollment resources at UCSF to get your questions answered and receive assistance in making health insurance choices.
